Alfie the Apostrophe is nervous. Can he make it into the punctuation-mark talent show? There's plenty of competition. Question marks tell riddles; exclamation points do cheerleading routines. And it looks as if the director, Bud Asterisk, has mistaken Alfie for a comma! Will all of Alfie's practice pay off?

The purpose of this study was to determine if the use of take-home poetry folders with skill-building fluency activities would increase first graders' reading fluency. For the duration of the treatment period, subjects took home poems per week to read with family members. Each poem had a set of skill-building fluency activities to complete with family members as well. In addition to the home activities, each poem was read and studied during shared reading time in the classroom. Subjects were given the DIBELS

Nonsense Word Fluency assessment as a pretest before the treatment began, and again as a posttest when the treatment period concluded. Posttest scores of subjects in the treatment class were compared to the DIBELS Nonsense Word Fluency assessment scores from students in a comparison group who did not receive the treatment. Data to determine the effectiveness of this study was collected through the use of running records, fluency rubrics, and anecdotal notes. The results of this study indicated that the use of take-home poetry folders with skill-building activities had a positive effect on first graders' reading fluency.

It also includes two sections to provide intervention for students struggling with developing reading fluency. Reading fluency has been identified as a key component of proficient reading. Research has consistently demonstrated significant and substantial correlations between reading fluency and overall reading achievement. Despite the great potential for fluency to have a significant outcome on students' reading achievement, it continues to be not well understood by teachers, school administrators and policy makers. The chapters in this volume examine reading fluency from a variety of perspectives. The initial chapter sketches the history of fluency as a literacy instruction component. Following chapters examine recent studies and approaches to reading fluency, followed by chapters that explore actual fluency instruction models and the impact of fluency instruction. Assessment of reading fluency is critical for monitoring progress and identifying students in need of intervention. Two articles on assessment, one focused on word recognition and the other on prosody, expand our understanding of fluency measurement. Finally, a study from Turkey explores the relationship of various reading competencies, including fluency, in an integrated model of reading. Our hope for this volume is that it may spark a renewed interest in research into reading fluency and fluency instruction and move toward making fluency instruction an even more integral part of all literacy instruction.
