Purpose of the study. The purpose of this study was to compare the academic achievement of students having had a "junior high school" educational experience to students having had a "middle school" educational experience. Since many schools adopt the name middle school without operationalizing the essential components of a true middle school, the study was especially concerned with schools which had implemented the programmatic characteristics identified as essential for a true middle school: (1) interdisciplinary teaming, (2) flexibly scheduled day, (3) exploratory program, and (4) adviser/advisee program. Procedures. Two groups of subjects were used. Both groups were limited to students who attended 9th and 10th grade at North High School. One group was comprised of 82 students who had attended 6th grade at one of the elementary feeder schools of West Junior High School and 7th and 8th grade at West Junior High School. The second group was comprised of 61 students who had attended 6th, 7th, and 8th grade at East Middle School. East Middle School and West Junior High School were feeder schools for North High School. Measures of student achievement (Missouri Mastery and Achievement Tests) in language arts, reading, social studies, and science were taken during the 5th grade, 6th grade, 7th grade, 8th grade and 10th grade. As a result of initial differences between schools, 5th grade MMAT scores were utilized as a covariate when testing the areas of language arts, social studies and science. Findings. In language arts, reading, mathematics, and social studies, no statistically significant differences were found between the two groups with the exception of a drop in scores between the 8th and 10th grade level for both groups. In science, 5th grade MMAT scores were utilized as a covariate to control for differences and statistically significant differences were found in the two schools. Students who progressed through East Middle School scored significantly higher in science at the 6th and 7th grade levels than students who progressed through West Junior High School.
