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illustrated with case-study material drawing on physical illness (HIV infection) and childhood sexual abuse. Each of these issues is examined in a way which

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demonstrates how different contemporary narratives and discourses are used to construct meaning and a sense of coherent identity in the face of traumatic events which break down

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temporal coherence and order. Taken as a whole, this book represents essential reading for students and researchers interested in narrative psychology.
