In the history of the world there has been no more controversial figure than Mary Magdalene, the Apostle that Jesus Christ loved. The Roman Catholic Church branded her a prostitute, attempting to erase her from history yet her legend lives

on. Was she Jesus' wife who traveled with him throughout Judea, spreading b'sartha (the good news), alongside him? As an Italian journalist, Nicolina Fabiani explores a horrific murder in Rome with her friend from the Vatican, Monsignor Edoardos Guiliani, a window into the times Jesus and Mary lived in opens up.
