But we are not living in one of those times; the fight over the Alamo's meaning has become more pitched than ever in the past few years, even violent, as Texas's future begins to look more and more different from its past. It's the perfect time for a wise and generousspirited book that shines the bright light of the truth into a place that's gotten awfully dark.
