Corporate training and payment systems based on skills and competencies are becoming more widespread among UK organizations. This study, commissioned by the EOC, explores the gender implications of this tendency. It includes a review of research evidence from the UK and USA.

This textbook provides a student focused approach, and has been written specifically for the revised Spectator Safety specifications. The book also covers content for the Certificate in Understanding Stewarding at Spectator Events.

A study examined the participation in education and training by adults from selected minority groups in Great Britain. The primary sample included 300 adults from the Caribbean and 300 from the Indian subcontinent. Two smaller exploratory samples were also surveyed, consisting of 100 adults of Chinese and 100 of black African origin. Findings regarding the education and training patterns of the individual groups were synthesized from unweighted data. In addition, the data for the total sample were weighted according to best estimates of the incidence of different groups resident in Great Britain and then analyzed to identify trends apparent in the sample as a whole. The groups represented in the survey demonstrated high levels of participation in education and training and very high levels of participation in informal learning. Among those who work, most education and training opportunities were not provided through current employers. Strong evidence of significant need and demand for the provision of accessible English language instruction and strong evidence of unmet demand across a broad range of mainly vocational subjects were also identified. The twelfth-century French poet Chrétien de Troyes is a major figure in European literature. His courtly romances fathered the Arthurian tradition and influenced countless other poets in England as well as on the continent. Yet because of the difficulty of capturing his swift-moving style in translation, English-speaking audiences are largely unfamiliar with the pleasures of reading his poems. Now, for the first time, an experienced translator of medieval verse who is himself a poet provides a translation of Chrétien's major poem, Yvain, in verse that fully and satisfyingly captures the

movement, the sense, and the spirit of the Old French original. Yvain is a courtly romance with a moral tenor; it is ironic and sometimes bawdy; the poetry is crisp and vivid. In addition, the psychological and the socio-historical perceptions of the poem are of profound literary and historical importance, for it evokes the emotions and the values of a flourishing, vibrant medieval past.
