

The Expansion Of Europe (Webster's Spanish Thesaurus Edition)

Die Mitglieder des Europäischen Parlaments werden von Wählern und Medien oft ignoriert. Die Arbeit der Abgeordneten wird als fern vom Bürger wahrgenommen, als ein weiterer intransparenter Europäischer Union. Ebenso fern scheint die nationale Ebene, welche die Europaabgeordneten für ihre Arbeit und weitere politische Karriere allerdings im Blick behalten müssen. Mit Onlinekommunikation auf persönlichen Webseiten kann diesen Problematiken begegnet werden, denn so ist eine ausführliche Darstellung der eigenen Arbeit möglich. Die Studie untersucht die Webseiten von Europaabgeordneten mit einer quantitativen Inhaltsanalyse, wobei die Themenfelder Information, Transparenz und Repräsentation im Fokus stehen. Dabei wird der Vergleich mit nationalen Abgeordneten angesetzt. Die Ergebnisse zeigen, dass die Unterschiede zwischen den politischen Ebenen sowie nationale und ideologische Faktoren Einfluss darauf haben, wie sich Parlamentarier online präsentieren. In this illuminating history, a senatorial debate about states' rights exemplifies the growing rift within pre-Civil War America. Two generations after the founding, Americans still disagreed on the nature of the Union. Was it a confederation of sovereign states or a nation headed by a central government? To South Carolina Senator Robert Y. Hayne, only the vigilant protection of states' rights could hold the Union together in the face of an attack on a southern way of life built on slavery. Meanwhile, Massachusetts Senator Daniel Webster believed that the political and economic ascendancy of New England—and the nation—required an activist national government. In The Webster-Hayne Debate, historian Christopher Childers examines a sharp dispute in January 1830 that came to define the dilemma of America's national identity. In a Senate discussion of western land policy, the senators' increasingly heated exchanges led to the question of union—its nature and its value in a federal republic. Childers argues that both Webster and the factions they represented, saw the West as key to the success of their political plans and sought to cultivate western support for their ideas. A short, accessible account of the conflict and the issues it addressed, The Webster-Hayne Debate captures an important moment in the early republic.

Annotation Daniel Webster (1782-1852) embodied the golden age of oratory in America by mastering each of the major genres of public speaking of the time. Even today, many of his victories before the Supreme Court remain as precedents. Webster served in the House, the Senate, and twice as secretary of state. He was so famous as a political orator that his reply "Liberty and Union, now and forever, one and inseparable!" to Senator Robert Hayne in a debate in 1830 was memorized by schoolboys and was on the lips of Northern soldiers as they charged forward in the Civil War. There would have been no 1850 Compromise without Webster, and without the Compromise, the Civil War might well have come earlier to an unprepared North. Webster was also the consummate ceremonial speaker. He advanced Whig virtues and solidified support for the Union through civil religion, creating a transcendent symbol for the nation that became a metaphor for the working constitutional framework. While several biographies have been written about Webster, none has focused on his oratorical talent. This study examines Webster's incredible career from the perspective of his great speeches and how they created a civil religion that moved citizens beyond loyalty and civic virtue to true romantic patriotism. Craig R. Smith places Webster's speeches in their historical context and then uses the tools of rhetorical criticism to analyze them. He demonstrates that Webster understood not only how rhetorical genres function to meet the expectations of the moment but also how they could be braided to produce long-lasting and literate discourse
