Eventually moving to the countryside in Angus, Rosie finds the isolation gives her a new meaning offering her the opportunity to re-value her beliefs about her own self-worth and how the time has come to give her son a memorial service and invite a chosen few dance companions she met on a regular basis in Edinburgh to honour this day. Rosie begins to accept she will never be the same person she once had been and shall never be again, believing now her journey through grief has taught her many lessons making her a stronger and better person than she imagined she could be. While studying objects in a textile collection, May opened a veritable treasure-trove: a carefully folded, unfinished quilt made of 1830s-era fabrics, its backing containing fragile, aged papers with the dates 1798, 1808, and 1813, the words "shuger," "rum," "casks," and "West Indies," repeated over and over, along with "friendship," "kindness," "government," and "incident." The quilt top sent her on a journey to piece together the story of Minerva, Eliza, Jane, and Juba—the enslaved women behind the quilt—and their owner, Susan Crouch. May brilliantly stitches together the often-silenced legacy of slavery by revealing the lives of these urban enslaved women and their world. Beautifully written and richly imagined, *An American Quilt* is a luminous historical examination and an appreciation of a craft that provides such a tactile connection to the past.

History and instruction are brought together in *An English Paper-Pieced Sampler* which features blocks like Bow Tie, Apple Core, and Castle Wall. Individual block instructions are provided with an additional bonus block included. Justice and Beltman review fundamentals for English Paper Piecing to get you ready to quilt.
