The Soviet Union had degraded into a totalitarian autocracy centred on a personality cult as a result of mass incarceration, secret summary trials, and executions. According to a letter to Yvonne Davet, Animal Farm was the first novel in which Orwell attempted, with full understanding of what he was doing, "to merge political meaning and aesthetic purpose into one whole."
