Heavy metals in soils continue to receive increasing attention due to the growing scientific and public awareness of environmental pollution. The development of analytical techniques to measure their concentrations accurately. Research was conducted between 1996 and 1998 with the aim of developing a methodology for assessing and monitoring educational quality in developing countries. The study was framed by the multi-disciplinary theoretical framework of socio-cultural research, drawing on the methodological orientation of action and intervention in research. In this case, 30 teachers each in Malawi and Sri Lanka participated in a system of activities in which they developed appropriate protocols for classroom-based assessment, designed and administered novel assessment tasks, collected evidence of children's work and discussed these collectively in groups, and recorded and presented their achievement in literacy and mathematics. Results indicated that in both countries teachers had reasonably good intuitive knowledge of learning and learning but inadequate systems for collecting and interpreting evidence of achievement in literacy and mathematics. Once exposed to the intervention process of the research, it became clear that teachers, despite enormous resource constraints, developed standards and norms based on their professional experiences, developed procedures for assessment, administered assessment tasks, assembled portfolios of evidence and assembled a profile of student achievements. Challenges to achieving this are not underestimated and vary between socio-cultural contexts. Four sets of profiles were developed in both English and the national languages of the countries: (1) oral literacy profiles; (2) reading profiles; (3) writing profiles; and (4) mathematical profiles. The study concludes that the intervention is a useful approach to developing insights into learning, teaching, and monitoring educational quality. (Contains 10 tables and 21 figures.) (Author/BT)

The report summarizes the key findings of an in-depth study of factors affecting access and equity in the Malawian higher education sub-sector, the quality and relevance of educational outputs, the financing of the sector, and the frameworks structuring governance of the sector and its management. The study was initiated in response to a request from the Government of Malawi, to the World Bank, to support the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology (MoEST) in its pursuit of financially sustainable policy options to increase equitable access to higher education, and to improve the quality of higher education provision in alignment with the needs of the labor market.

In 1994, the World Bank significantly expanded the information that it makes available to the public. In 2001, after a major review of the information disclosure policy, involving extensive public consultations, the Bank again increased the range of documents it discloses and streamlined access to that information. This statement sets out the revised disclosure policy. It supersedes 'the World Bank policy on disclosure of information, ' published in March 1994. The policy is effective January 1, 2002. The implementation of the revised policy has been phased in, beginning January 1, 2002. Policy revisions with respect to particular categories of documents take effect on the dates indicated in appendix one to this statement. This document is organized as follows: after the Introduction, part two sets out the Bank's disclosure policy. Part three specifies the categories of information available to the general public or to interested individuals and groups. Finally, part four indicates the constraints that, while kept to a minimum, preclude the disclosure of some information.

International evidence indicates that keeping girls in school positively impacts their life trajectory and benefits the well-being of the next generation. Malawi has made progress in increasing overall enrollment rates, but additional effort is still needed to ensure that adolescent girls stay in school and complete a quality education. Starting in the upper grades of primary school, adolescent girls are more likely to drop out of school than their male counterparts with pregnancy, early marriage, and school fees frequently cited as the main reasons. One of the key challenges in Malawi will be to both focus on girls before they reach puberty and ensure that they get the support they need to complete primary school and successfully transition to secondary school. Meanwhile, adolescent boys will also need support and guidance to invest in their own education and to value the education of their female peers as a way to build stronger families and communities and break the inter-generational cycle of poverty. The Government of Malawi will need to assess the effectiveness and sustainability of its policy and programs, including those by partners, to scale and consolidate accordingly in order to avoid a scattered approach.

Improving the quality of education is difficult today when many schools are experiencing a steady decline in student enrollment and financial resources. In such a climate it is increasingly important to stretch resources and adjust programs to provide for the diverse needs of all students. The National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP) has developed a process model for reducing curriculum while maintaining the elements essential for educational quality. This guide for curricular analysis and decision-making is intended to give direction to principals and school communities in setting curricular priorities, making reductions, and finding alternatives. Since cutbacks in courses or programs are almost always controversial, great emphasis is placed on the quality and scope of information, the establishment of criteria, and the opportunity to hear all viewpoints. Course-rating sheets for students, departments, and committee members are appended to the guide. (Author/MLF)

This third edition of the book has been completely re-written, providing a wider scope and enhanced coverage. It covers the general principles of the natural occurrence, pollution sources, chemical analysis, soil chemical behaviour and soil-plant-animal relationships of heavy metals and metalloids, followed by a detailed coverage of 21 individual elements, including: antimony, arsenic, barium, cadmium, chromium, cobalt, copper, gold, lead, manganese, mercury, molybdenum, nickel, selenium, silver, thallium, tin, tungsten, uranium, vanadium and zinc. The book is highly relevant for those involved in environmental science, soil science, geochemistry, agronomy, environmental health, and environmental engineering, including specialists responsible for the management and clean-up of contaminated land.

Universities and societies around the world are involved in significant transition. Universities are now invited to expand their central aims and purposes in order to embrace a role in relation to the development of the societies in which they are located. This change of focus has major implications for curricula, modes of teaching and the student body. Despite decades of development efforts supported by significant amounts of foreign aid, Malawi has experienced weak and volatile economic growth performance over a sustained period of time. Malawi's growth remains an outlier even compared to its geographically and demographically similar peers. Moreover, growth has been distributed unequally, with little impact on poverty. Per capita income has improved only minimally in the 50 years since independence, and Malawi now has one of the lowest per capita incomes in the world. From Falling Behind to Catching Up aims to improve readers' understanding of the puzzle of Malawi's development performance and identify ways for the country to achieve robust growth and stay on a stable growth path that helps the poor. The book places a strong emphasis on assessing Malawi's growth experience since independence from a comparative international perspective. It seeks to benchmark Malawian outcomes on growth, structural change, and transformation against peers and explores possible reasons for divergence from international trends. The book also puts deeper drivers of economic growth at the center of the discussion, looking in particular at the institutions and policies that may have affected Malawi's growth outcomes and ones that could help Malawi avoid macroeconomic instability in the future. This book first begins by discussing Malawi's macroeconomic situation and challenges in fiscal management, reviewing and drawing lessons from the instability, slippages, and shocks Malawi has experienced since independence. Second, given how critical the agricultural sector is to poverty reduction in Malawi, the overview explores the

current state of agricultural markets. Third, looking at the factors that may constrain higher growth in the future, challenges in private sector development and job creation are discussed. Finally, building on the analysis of challenges, the book concludes with a summary of policy recommendations aimed at helping Malawi begin catching up with its peers.

The analysis incorporates data and information from multiple sources, such as school administrative surveys by the Ministry of Education, household surveys, and a tracer survey created especially for this study. This CSR, developed by a ministerial national team supported by UNESCO P le de Dakar, the World Bank, and GTZ specialists, updates the previous one drawn up in 2000 and consists of eight chapters, including a chapter on higher education. The analysis provides key monitoring and evaluation inputs for the education sector, particularly under the framework of the implementation of the National Education Sector Plan.
