Introduction to Veterinary and Comparative Forensic Medicine is a ground-breaking book in an emerging new speciality. This volume approaches the history of the great city of Alexandria from a variety of directions: its demography, the interaction between Greek and Egyptian and between Jews and Greeks, the nature of its civil institutions and social relations, and its religious, and intellectual history.

Ibn Zuhr (or Avenzoar) of twelfth-century Seville was the most important physician of Muslim Spain. His family boasted six generations of physicians, and also included midwives, jurists, poets, and viziers. His *Kitab al-taysir*, a compendium of therapeutics, was translated into Latin and Hebrew; its Latin version, *Liber Teisir*, served as a companion book to the *Colliget*, the Latin translation of *Kitab al-kulliyat*, a largely theoretical book of the philosopher-physician Ibn Rushd (Averroes). The rabbi-physician Maimonides quoted extensively from Ibn Zuhr

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and considered him "unique in his age and one of the great sages." But Ibn Zuhr was not just a keen observer of patients and a dispenser of remedies: buried within his generally dry narrative are candid recollections and views on a variety of subjects and of his society. And his medical recipes could be compared to current forms of alternative medicine. Together, his holistic approach to medicine and his spontaneous vignettes make him one of the most refreshing physicians of any age. This account of the life and legacy of Ibn Zuhr, the first of its kind, reveals the man and his world, his importance in his own times, and his relevance to our world today. Against a modern culture of often impersonal, bureaucratized, and costly health care, Ibn Zuhr's embodiment of the wisdom of the ages and his role as healer-priest can be an inspiration.

Ibn Zuhr, His Time, and His Medical Legacy

This book presents a translation of and detailed commentary on Galen's *De alimentorum facultatibus* - his major work on the dynamics and kinetics of various foods. It is thus primarily a physiological treatise rather than a *materia medica* or a work on pathology. Galen commences with a short section on the epistemology of medicine, with a discussion on the attainment, through *apodeixis* or demonstration, of scientific truth - a discussion which reveals the Aristotelian roots of

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his thinking. The text then covers a wide range of foods, both common and exotic. Some, such as cereals, legumes, dairy products and the grape, receive an emphasis that reflects their importance at the time; others are treated more cursorily. Dr Powell, an expert in gastroenterology, discusses Galen's terminology and the background to his views on physiology and pathology in his introduction, while John Wilkins' foreword concentrates on the structural and cultural aspects of the work.
