In some cases, the plans may include academic programs that are being discussed or considered for the future, but that may not be realistic given the current fiscal constraints facing the NSHE. However, they are included in the report as an indication of what may come if funds should become available either through grants or public support. Many of the anticipated programs are projected to be funded with federal grants, making some programs more likely than others to begin in this time of limited state resources. To that end, these lists may be viewed as "wish lists" based on resource availability. Because this report is updated and published every two years, it is often the case that institutions may have programs on the list from several years back and continue to roll them forward in the hope that eventually resources will be available to develop such programs. The plans are intended to notify various constituencies, including the Board of Regents and the Legislature, of what institutions are hoping to develop and believe is needed for them to meet their mission and the needs of the state, but they may not be construed as definitive in terms of the date of implementation.
