Banks will be required to undertake an immigration status check before opening a current account. Part 4, and Schedules 4, 5 and 6, contain new powers to investigate suspected sham marriages and civil partnerships and extend powers for information to be shared by, and with, registration officials. Part 5, and Schedule 7, strengthen the powers of the Office of the Immigration Services Commissioner and simplify the regulatory scheme for the immigration advice sector. Part 6 contains five miscellaneous matters and Part 7 covers general provisions.
