The book provides worksheets for use in close study lessons that help readers have fun while they use their creativity. The book can also develop new thinking skills as readers learn about delightful Himalayan, Siamese, Calico, American Short hair, Persian, Savannah and Serval caats. The common thread that runs throughout the book is having fun with words and using the creativity of the reader to paint his/her own word pictures. Additionally, the project includes a chart with a sample classroom library with book titles, authors, DRA levels, and total read-aloud time and three sample completed lesson plans for use in the lower elementary grade levels.
