This book is aimed at a fairly broad market: it is intended to aid the linear design engineer to cross the barrier into digital electronics; it

should provide interesting supporting reading for students studying digital electronics from the more academic viewpoint; and it should enable the enthusiast to design much more ambitious and sophisticated projects than he could otherwise attempt if restricted to linear devices.
