Why did they say what they said? 4 Lesson Activity uses the words and phrases so far in a small grammar-based activity. The students should understand the grammar point by the first lesson. 5 Practical is part 2 of the lesson subject, complete with a presentation or review. You can build lessons with a step-by-step process for running fun and educational classes. We can adapt the lessons to run from 30 to 90 minutes. Start with about 5-10 minutes of free talking, covering how the students are, what they have been doing, and your contributions.
