Vidal explores the
expressions and
failures of

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democracy throughout history, and the current threats to its existence around the globe in A Changing World. Vidal, author of over 180 books and possessing Ph.Ds. in history, philosophy, law, and theology, connects the dots between the

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collapse of national sovereignty and global warming, illegal immigration, gender ideology, national debt, and a globalist agenda. A Changing World details in five parts—a history of democracy, its threats, and options for the future,

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explaining the following: The foundations of modern democracy and the preponderant role of the Reformation in vital notions such as the supremacy of the law, limited power, and the separation of powers. Similarly, the author explores

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how these concepts took root in America and gave rise to the emergence of the United States, distinguishing this nation from European countries. The risks facing democracy and how these dangers arose. Starting from an analysis of

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contemporary
philosophical
ideologies, he moves
on to the emergence
of interventionist
States, from the
origin of Marxism,

fall of communism,

fascism in Europe.
The threat of the
globalist agenda, its

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main
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promoters—from
Soros to Pope
Francis—as well as
the dogmas that
compose it: global
warming, gender
ideology, population
reduction, and the
defense of illegal
immigration, all
issues that severely
affect contemporary

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society. The evolution of Europe and the emergence of the European Union as the end of independent nations. He then addresses the case of Latin America and the roots of its constant economic and governmental crises. He analyzes the

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current situations of
Venezuela, Chile,

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elder sibling, it is in many ways the more interesting of the two. It seeks to redefine global news coverage by focusing on areas that are traditionally neglected by most news organizations, and its potential audience is many times larger than

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that of the Arabic channel. This will be the first book to thoroughly examine this channel's coverage methods, effects on its audience, and its place in the world of mediated geopolitics. Al Jazeera recognized that if it was to

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expand its worldwide influence, it could not do so wholly in Arabic. And so, in 2006, it launched Al Jazeera English, the first English-language news channel to be headquartered in the Middle East. With its principal broadcast centers in Doha,

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Washington,
London, and Kuala
Lumpur, the channel

faced the task of proving itself to be more than a curiosity and just a junior version of the all-news English-language channels such as the BBC or CNN. After several years of operation,

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Al Jazeera English seems well on its way to defining its place in the market. The breadth of its coverage, particularly its emphasis on reporting from the global South, has distinguished it from many of its competitors.

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Thorough coverage from the Middle East and from Africa provides a perspective that other major satellite channels have rarely offered their audiences. Initially, Al Jazeera English was available to 80 million cable and satellite households.

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It was, however, accessible by only a small number of viewers in the United States (mainly those accessing it through several online providers) primarily because of political reasons. Whatever the political back-story may be, gaining access to a

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larger global market will depend on audience demand. If Al Jazeera English does a better job of covering major stories, particularly in the Middle East and the global South, than other channels do, and if its competitors find themselves saying,

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"As Al Jazeera English reported today . . .," news consumers will eventually demand access. This book will examine these political issues and will also analyze the channel's audience base, particularly in Africa and South Asia. The book will

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also offer evaluations of Al Jazeera English's defining moments to date - its reporting during the 2008-2009 war in Gaza (written by Palestinian and Israeli scholars), and its coverage of the "Ground Zero Mosque" controversy in 2010.

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The volume will also consider Al Jazeera English in the context of public diplomacy and the growing significance of diasporic populations.

Why do we need fiction? Why do books need to be printed on paper, copyrighted, read to

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the finish? Do we read to challenge our vision of the world or to confirm it? Has novel writing turned into a job like any other? In *Where I'm Reading From*, the novelist and critic Tim Parks ranges over decades of critical reading—from Leopardi, Dickens,

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and Chekhov, to Virginia Woolf, D. H. Lawrence, and Thomas Bernhard, and on to contemporary work by Peter Stamm, Alice Munro, and many others—to upend our assumptions about literature and its purpose. In thirty-

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seven interlocking essays, *Where I'm Reading From* examines the rise of the "international" novel and the disappearance of "national" literary styles; how market forces shape "serious" fiction; the unintended effects of translation; the

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growing stasis of literary criticism; and the problematic relationship between writers' lives and their work. Through dazzling close readings and probing self-examination, Parks wonders whether writers—and readers—can escape

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the twin pressures of
the new global

system and the novel

that has become its
emblematic genre.
