The purpose of this research is to examine the entrepreneurial ethics among small scale entrepreneurs. The study has been commenced with three objectives such as, measuring demographic background, entrepreneurial ethics in functional areas and developing entrepreneurial ethics. The study has been started with 100 small scale entrepreneurs and it is randomly selected. The required primary data was obtained by using a structured questionnaire design. The total number of questionnaires distributed was 286, out of which 260 were returned. Descriptive research design was used for formulating the research study. The statistical tools used include simple percentage analysis, Kendall's Coefficient of Concordance with the necessary hypothesis and T-test. The results showed that integrity is the most important factor while maintaining ethics among small scale entrepreneurs, it is followed by public spiritedness, accountability, transparency, honesty and fairness in the different functional areas. Kendall's coefficient of concordance rejects null hypothesis and it stated that there is significance difference in ranking by the entrepreneurs as to different functional areas. Developing entrepreneurial ethics is mainly depend on straight forward mentality, responsiveness, support to all stakeholders, customer relationship and moral values. It can be concluded that entrepreneurial ethics is required so as to make better external ethical image, and to have a functional and credible business environment.

1.1 Introduction: The entrepreneurs of the small industry have a prominent role in a developing economy, as the success of these industrial enterprises depends largely upon the capabilities and the talents of the entrepreneurs and there by promotes the industrialization process. Focusing on Karnataka in India, this study examines the implications of the model of development sought to be introduced in the entire country through the governance reforms of the post-1991 period – a model that bypasses Panchayat Raj institutions (PRIs), resulting in a majority of the population being left outside the purview of development. These changes in governance resulted in, among other things, the prolific growth of NGOs in the country, particularly in Karnataka. Explaining how community-based organizations (CBOs) set up by these NGOs have made their way into rural Karnataka, this book expresses concern over how they now perform functions that rightly belong to PRIs following the 73rd Amendment to the Constitution which devotes 29 functions to local self-government, passing on the funds they receive from the centre to their district and village branches, though these should actually go to PRIs. The book argues that elected representatives have been put in place by the people at all levels, and it is they who should take decisions regarding the development of this country. In the post-liberalisation period, governance through institutions that eschew political decentralisation is fraught with hazards. Not only will avenues for the expression of people 's wishes be lacking in such a scenario, but there will also be increasing inequality, resulting in a skewed development. The inclusiveness which the present government seeks will elude them unless they restore and strengthen Panchayat Raj institutions.

It then demonstrates the application of that framework in the context of the south Indian city of Bengaluru (formerly Bangalore). Drawing on the 'law-and-community' approach of Roger Cotterrell, the volume identifies three mechanisms through which law might, in theory, ensure that social relations are productive: by expressing any mutual trust which may hold actors together, by ensuring that actors participate fully in social life and by coordinating the differences that hold actors apart. Empirical data reveals that each of these legal mechanisms is at work in Bengaluru. However, their operation is limited and skewed by the extent to which actors use, abuse and/or avoid them. Furthermore, these legal mechanisms are being eroded as a direct result of the World Bank's 'investment climate' discourse, which privileges the interests and values of foreign investors over those of other actors.
