Phoneme segmentation is a technique for building phonemic awareness in which students break words into sounds - saying each sound separately as they stretch out the word. Ie. Teacher asks, "How many sounds are there in the word frog?" Students say, "/f/ /r/ /o/ /g/...4 sounds!"
