Ma la depressione era una malattia che non lo aveva lasciato, nonostante quella serenità che mostrava dopo la nascita pochi mesi prima della prima figlia, Lucia. Ancora quattro anni, poi, sempre quella subdola malattia aveva avuto di nuovo il sopravvento su di lui e questa volta era riuscito a chiudere, ad appena quarantanove anni, la propria esistenza lasciandosi sommergere dalle acque del Ticino.
