This completely revised edition of the classic text presents multidisciplinary, interdisciplinary, and transdisciplinary approaches to curriculum integration, covering instructional strategies, assessment tasks, and daily learning activities.

Contextual integration (CI) has been embraced as a method of teaching and creating medical education programs around the world. However, medical schools seem to struggle when integrating this content. This is possibly a consequence of the confusing definitions of CI that are anchored on diverse learning theories. Thus, clarifying the framework of CI may provide stakeholders insights into how to succeed in the endeavor of analyzing, designing, implementing and evaluating an integrated curriculum. This thesis aimed to understand medical CI from a contextual perspective by answering what the meanings of CI are in the practice of two types of integrated curricula. To answer it, we analyzed the stakeholders' subjective experiences of their problem-based learning curriculum and built four theoretical constructs of CI. Then, we transferred the constructs to understand the meanings of the practice of an integrated- systems cumculum. By doing this, we refined and extended our theoretical constructs.

This first-of-its-kind textbook marks a revolutionary effort to reform medical education nationally by providing a comprehensive, high-quality resource to serve as a foundation for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ) health education across multiple disciplines. **INTEGRATED NEUROSCIENCES** This textbook takes as a premise that, in order to make intelligent diagnosis and provide a rational treatment in disorders of the nervous system, it is necessary to develop the capacity to answer the basic questions of clinical neurology: (1) Where is the disease process located? (2) What is the nature of the disease process? The purpose of this textbook is to enable the medical student to acquire the basic information of the neurosciences and neurology and most importantly the ability to apply that information to the solution of clinical problems. The authors also suggest that hospital trips be a part of any Clinical Neurosciences Course so that the student can put into actual practice what he has learned in the classroom. We believe that this textbook will be of value to the student throughout the four years of the medical school curriculum. Medical, psychiatry and neurology residents may also find this text of value as an introduction or review. It is more true in neurology than in any other system of medicine that a firm knowledge of basic science material, that is, the anatomy, physiology and pathology of the nervous system, enables the student and physician to readily arrive at the diagnosis of where the disease process is located and the nature of the most likely pathology. Subsequently that knowledge may be applied to problem solving in clinical situations.
