It will be useful to people without specialized knowledge of Italian literature as well as to scholars.

How do we represent ouselves and the cultures we live in? Is it possible to trace any boundaries between reality and self-representation? Because the self represented is the product of a process of selection and choice, in many ways to represent the self is, often simultaneously, to create the self and negate the self. What, then, becomes of the self once it is represented? Because the process of self-representation cumulates in a tangible result and given that any representation of the self is necessarily a construct which aims to render visible or knowable in concrete form the unseen and unknown, self-representation is vulnerable to assessments of its naturalness or artificiality, its honesty or deceit. Many issues affect the author or artist's self-representation, both as process and form: the medium through which the self will be represented, the motivation for representing oneself, and the role of the audience, to name only a few relevant factors. Nella casa di psiche ha preso dimora un ospite inquietante che chiede, con una radicalità finora sconosciuta, il senso dell'esistenza. Gli altri ospiti, che già abitavano la casa, obiettano che la domanda è vecchia quanto il mondo, perché, dal giorno in cui sono nati, gli uomini hanno conosciuto il dolore, la miseria, la malattia, il disgusto, l'infelicità e persino il “disagio della civiltà” a cui prima le pratiche religiose, poi quelle terapeutiche, con la psicoanalisi in prima fila, hanno tentato di porre rimedio. L'uomo soffre per l'“insensatezza” del suo lavoro, per il suo sentirsi “soltanto un mezzo” nell'“universo dei mezzi”, senza che all'orizzonte appaia una finalità prossima o una finalità ultima in grado di conferire senso. Sembra infatti che la tecnica non abbia altro scopo se non il proprio autopotenziamento. Di fronte a questa diagnosi, la psicoanalisi rivela tutta la sua impotenza, perché gli strumenti di cui dispone, se sono utilissimi per la comprensione delle dinamiche emotivo-relazionali, per i processi di simbolizzazione sono inefficaci. Qui occorre la pratica filosofica perché, fin dal suo sorgere, la filosofia si è applicata alla ricerca di senso. E mentre la psicoanalisi, nei suoi momenti più alti, si è limitata a curare le sofferenze dell'anima provocate dalle condizioni del mondo, ottenendo come risultato una presa di distanza individuale dal vuoto di senso, la filosofia non ha mai esitato a mettere in questione il mondo. Dall'insensatezza non si esce con una “cura”, perché il disagio non nasce dall'individuo, ma dal suo essere inserito in uno scenario, quello tecnico, di cui gli sfugge la comprensione. E se il problema è la comprensione, gli strumenti filosofici sono gli unici idonei per orientarsi in un mondo il cui senso, per l'uomo, si sta facendo sempre più recondito e nascosto.

The past few years have witnessed a growing academic interest in Italian Studies and an increasing number of symposia and scholarly activities. This volume originates from the Society for Italian Studies Postgraduate Colloquia that took place at the University of Leicester and Cambridge in June 2004 and April 2005 respectively. It gathers together articles by young researchers working on various aspects of Italian Studies. It well illustrates current trends in both typical areas of research, like literature and 'high culture', and in those which have gained momentum in recent years, like translation and language studies. The volume offers a taste of the dynamic outlook of current research in Italian Studies: the interdisciplinary approach of the essays in translation and gender studies, and the innovative methodological perspectives and findings offered by the new fields of Italian L2 and ethnography. The book is divided into three sections, each grouping contributions by broad subject areas: literature and culture, translation and gender studies, language and linguistics. Cross-fertilizations and interdisciplinary research emerge from several essays and the coherent ensemble constitutes an example of the far-reaching results achieved by current research.

Modern Italian drama ranks among the most important and influential in the western world, yet it has long been inaccessible to English-language readers. Finally, an anthology is available of the best and the brightest in Italian theater, including never-before-translated work by Luigi Pirandello, Pier Maria Rosso di San Secondo, Massimo Bontempelli, Italo Svevo, Eduardo De Filippo, and Alberto Savinio. This volume of Twentieth-Century Italian Drama covers the period spanning from the end of the nineteenth century to that immediately following World War II, displaying the rich breadth of Italian theater in the modern age, from the comedic legacy carried on by such writers as Eduardo De Filippo to the delicate tragedy of playwrights like Federigo Tozzi. Guided by Italian theater critic Antonio Attisani's authoritative introduction, readers will discover the fascinating world of Italian literature: the aesthetic-mystical movement, futurism, teatro grottesco, magical realism, the Catholic strain of drama, and cabaret and variety theater. Twentieth-Century Italian Drama sheds new light on the period of Italian history marked by the reign of Mussolini's fascist regime, offering unprecedented cultural perspective on the changes this wrought on the dramatic productions of the day. Included are seven full-length plays, five one-act plays, one variety sketch, and three futurist sintesi (sketches). Brief introductions preceding each play contextualize the piece within the various movements in Italian theater, and biographies of the editors and translators appear at the end of the volume. An extensive bibliography offers many suggestions for further reading in English. Here, actors and directors will find stage-ready versions of the finest Italian dramatic works. Other readers interested in Italian literature, comparative literature, theater, and the humanities will also appreciate the opportunity to read this important body of work. Twentieth-Century Italian Drama provides unique insight into the profound influence of the Italian theater on the dramatic productions of other nations, and puts into perspective the broader spectrum of European drama.
