Ernest Bramah Smith was born near Manchester in 1868. He was a poor student, and dropped out of the Manchester Grammar School when sixteen years old to go into the farming business. Bramah found commercial and critical success with his first novel, The Wallet of Kai Lung, but it was his later stories of detective Max Carrados that assured him lasting fame.

The third book in a cosy crime series about amateur-sleuth Holly Millar and her crime-solving pets, Trixie the dog and Twinkletoes the kitten, set in the most pet-friendly Inn in America. Krista Davis' Murder Most Howl sees Holly take over her grandmother's inn and throw a weekend-long murder mystery game to draw in tourists. Trouble is unleashed the night the game begins, when the storm blows

in and the lights go out. It gets worse the following morning when Holly's Jack Russell terrier, Trixie, discovers a body - one that's actually dead.

Working in Gaborone, Botswana, Precious Ramotswa investigates several local mysteries, including a search for a missing boy and the case of the clinic doctor with different personalities for different days of the week.

When four friends stumble across the body of a fellow club member during a game of golf they suspect murder. The police aren't so sure, and when it looks as though the official verdict will be suicide the men are outraged. Convinced that there had been 'dirty work' and that 'the police aren't very good at following up clues', they undertake their own investigation. A classic Golden Age whodunit that involves the reader in a charming game of detection as the protagonists use Sherlockian methods to unravel the mystery.
