Yes, the family tales she'd heard were true: There had been a murder in Helene's family, a killing that roiled 1870s Italy. In revisiting events that happened more than a century before, Helene came to another stunning realization—she wasn't who she thought she was, either. *In their first book, Ten Rules for Strategic Innovators, the authors provided a better model for executing disruptive innovation.
