Statement of Problem: Firearm violence is a growing concern in the United States. The American Association of Nurse Practitioners (2018) addressed concerns for the growing issue of firearm violence and the need for more research. Quality research focusing on family nurse practitioners and firearm counseling is lacking. With current and future nurse practitioners continuing to move into the role of primary care provider, it is important to initiate discussion among all disciplines and seek out support from professional nursing organizations for future research exploring firearm counseling.

Sources of Data: Data was collected from a census sample of all family nurse practitioner students currently enrolled at California State University San Marcos. Students completed a paper survey that included demographic data, and the Modified Price Questionnaire (Price et al., 2013)

Conclusions Reached: This was a descriptive study that explained family nurse practitioner students' attitudes about firearm counseling to their patients. In addition, this study explained students' attitudes about firearm violence in the U.S., barriers to discussing firearm issues with their patients, beliefs about their roles in discussing firearms, and their confidence in firearm counseling. This study found a statistical significance in the relationship between students that had begun

clinical fieldwork and their belief that patients may perceive discussing firearm issues as an intrusion of privacy (p=. 008)

Nurses make up the largest segment of the health care profession, with 3 million registered nurses in the United States. Nurses work in a wide variety of settings, including hospitals, public health centers, schools, and homes, and provide a continuum of services, including direct patient care, health promotion, patient education, and coordination of care. This book focuses on an organization, the U.S. Army Nurse Corps, which the author has been privileged to be affiliated with - in one way or another - for the greatest part of her adult life. As an active duty officer, the author had first-hand knowledge about the Army Nurse Corps inner workings and spent the last years of her Army career (from 1992) researching and writing the Corps history. One of her goals in researching and writing this history was to intrigue and provide a sense of gratification for the reader. After the conclusion of the Vietnam War, several wide-ranging and significant changes exerted myriad effects on the Army Nurse Corps. The most influential of these phenomena included the dismantling of the Selective Service System, the reorganization of the Army, the launch of the Health Services Command (HSC), the opening of the Academy of Health Sciences, the transformation of the

Office of the Army Surgeon General, the inauguration of improvements in the Army Reserve and National Guard, and the evolution in the roles and status of women.

Hospitals and nursing homes are responding to changes in the health care system by modifying staffing levels and the mix of nursing personnel. But do these changes endanger the quality of patient care? Do nursing staff suffer increased rates of injury, illness, or stress because of changing workplace demands? These questions are addressed in *Nursing Staff in Hospitals and Nursing Homes*, a thorough and authoritative look at today's health care system that also takes a long-term view of staffing needs for nursing as the nation moves into the next century. The committee draws fundamental conclusions about the evolving role of nurses in hospitals and nursing homes and presents recommendations about staffing decisions, nursing training, measurement of quality, reimbursement, and other areas. The volume also discusses work-related injuries, violence toward and abuse of nursing staffs, and stress among nursing personnel--and examines whether these problems are related to staffing levels. Included is a readable overview of the underlying trends in health care that have given rise to urgent questions about nurse staffing: population changes, budget pressures, and the introduction of new technologies. *Nursing Staff in Hospitals and Nursing Homes* provides a straightforward examination of complex and sensitive issues surround the role and value of

nursing on our health care system.

The book is an evocative, narrative writing about nursing and nursing issues that addresses nursing as the care of the sick, and the tneding of the environment within which care happens. Collaborative nurse practitioner and physician primary health care service provision has the potential to improve access, ensure quality, and promote cost effective primary health care and case management for frail elders. Through a critical appraisal of research, this paper will seek to explore outcomes regarding the provision of collaborative nurse practitioner and physician community based primary health care service for the frail elderly. The research substantiates that collaborative nurse practitioner and physician health care service provision to at-risk seniors reduces emergency department utilization, reduces admissions to hospitals and nursing homes, and maintains or improves functional capacity. Three integrated health care service delivery models will be discussed, critiqued, and woven into these research findings to serve as a framework to sift these research finding into practice. Finally, recommendations based on this research will be proposed for integration into the Northern Health Authority Integrated Health Network for at-risk seniors in Fort St. John, B.C. for application of these research findings in practice...--P.ii.
