professional milieu in which each novel takes place. *La Curée (The Kill)* explores the land speculation and financial dealings that accompanied the renovation of Paris during the Second Empire. *Le Ventre de Paris (Savage Paris; also translated as The Fat and the Thin)* examines the structure of the Halles, the vast central marketplace of Paris. *Son Excellence Eugène Rougon (His Excellency Eugène Rougon)* traces the machinations and maneuverings of cabinet officials in Napoleon III's government. *L'Assommoir (Drunkard)* shows the effects of alcoholism in a working-class neighbourhood by focusing on the rise and decline of a laundress, Gervaise Macquart. *Nana* follows the life of Gervaise's daughter as her economic circumstances and hereditary penchants lead her to a career as an actress, then a courtesan. *Au Bonheur des dames (Ladies' Delight)* depicts the mechanisms of a new economic entity, the department store, and its impact on smaller merchants. *Germinal* depicts life in a mining community by highlighting relations between the bourgeoisie and the working class.
