The first offers resources for screening and assessment tools, the second provides a select list of websites for parents who are seeking advice and resources about drug prevention and intervention, and the third lists websites containing general information about self-help, including how to find local AA or NA meetings. Emerging research on developmental psychopathology and adolescent development has implications for how we view current prevention, intervention, and treatment paradigms, and *Clinical Manual of Youth Addictive Disorders* is indispensable in helping the reader understand and implement effective strategies for these patients and their families.*

"We're pivoting from a white-black-dominated American population to one that is multiracial and multicultural."
