to understand why the directions work so that you can understand how to modify them to work properly at or beyond their original limitations. That's where JavaScript Allongé comes in. JavaScript Allongé

of escaping failure (often by improving skills) is a central enjoyment of games. Games, writes Juul, are the art of failure: the singular art form that sets us up for failure and allows us to experience

it and experiment with it. The Art of Failure is essential reading for anyone interested in video games, whether as entertainment, art, or education.
