I carried this emotional baggage with me into my fifties. I lugged it around while I was in paid music ministry in local churches... My false belief system, combined with some experiences, hurt me more than helped me, and I am to some degree still paying the consequences. In the same year, Khalid warred with New York's Mayor, Rudy Giuliani, over the Million Youth March, which ended with a violent clash between the marchers and N.Y. police. Khalid was also a force behind the LA riots, that resulted from the Rodney King police beating in 1992, which has led to the current uprisings against police killings all over America. In his career, Khalid was constantly compared to the iconic freedom fighter, Malcolm X. He is still revered today as a hip-hop icon, due to his appearances on multi-platinum selling albums by Public Enemy and Ice Cube. In addition to his relationship with the immortal rapper, Tupac Shakur.
