The two decades between 1945 and 1965 saw some remarkable motor cars emerge from the new Rolls-Royce factory at Crewe. The Mark VI Bentley was the first model to be built entirely by Rolls-Royce, using a body supplied by Pressed Steel, although coachbuilt cars were still available. The Rolls-Royce Silver Dawn version followed in 1949, this and its Bentley sister both receiving 'big boot' bodies in 1952. Meanwhile the 120mph Continental appeared. The entirely new Rolls-Royce Silver Cloud and Bentley S-series, almost identical to each other, arrived in 1955, and from 1959 a V8 was installed. By their side, coachbuilt S-series Continentals continued. Original Rolls-Royce & Bentley 1946-65 is the essential companion to these cars. The aim of this book is to reveal, in words and color photographs, how the various models altered through the course of production. Drawing on factory records, parts lists, catalogs and other data, the author has provided a meticulous survey of the standard steel cars built at Crewe. Over 250 specially commissioned color photographs, showing the detail changes to these cars, accompany the authoritative text.

Der Rolls-Royce Silver Spirit (dt: Silberner Geist; Geist im Sinne von Seele) ist ein Auto der Oberklasse des britischen Herstellers Rolls-Royce Motors. Bei dem Wagen handelt es sich um den Nachfolger des Rolls-Royce Silver Shadow. In verschiedenen Versionen (Mark I oder Mk. I bis Mk. IV) und unter verschiedenen Namen wurde er von 1980 bis 1998 produziert. Der Rolls-Royce Silver Spirit ist baugleich mit dem Bentley Mulsanne. Einige Varianten waren sowohl als Rolls-Royce als auch als Bentley verfügbar, andere nur als Rolls-Royce oder nur als Bentley. Nach der mit 28476 produzierten Rolls-Royce Silver Shadow/Silver Wraith und 3867 baugleichen Bentley T bis dahin erfolgreichsten Baureihe der damaligen Doppelmarke Rolls-Royce/Bentley wurde dieses 1965 vorgestellte Modell im Jahr 1980 durch den Silver Spirit abgelöst. Fur die Gestaltung des Fahrzeugs war Fritz Feller verantwortlich. Die Konstruktion des Silver Spirit erfolgte auf der Bodengruppe des Silver Shadow. Der Motor des Silver Spirit war zunächst der vom Silver Shadow bekannte 6,75-l-V8-Doppelvergasermotor. Rolls-Royce and Bentley relied upon standardised body designs after 1945, but for the next two decades both marques also supplied chassis frames separately, and it was possible to have these clothed with coachwork by bespoke coachbuilders like, for example, Mulliner, Park Ward and James Young in Britain, or Graber, Farina and Franay in Europe. Many buyers took this route, and this highly illustrated book bears witness to the wide variety of styles that were built in this fascinating period. Chassis number lists for each coachbuilder, both in Britain and overseas, identify their creations, to make this a comprehensive and essential companion for anyone interested in Rolls-Royce and Bentley in the postwar era. Coachwork on Rolls-Royce and Bentley, 1945-1965 joins the author's recent work Coachwork on Derby Bentleys 1933-1940 in our list.

The first Silver Cloud and S-type models were introduced in 1955 and the last one built was some 11 years later. Starting with a disadvantage in having a separate chassis and body when monocoque construction was gaining ground they lagged behind other manufacturers. Nevertheless they drove extremely well and ran without failure for many thousands of miles. The majority had standard steel coachwork which was very elegant while specialist coachbuilders were able to create their magic for those fortunate enough to afford it. This is a book of contemporary road and comparison tests, specification and technical data, road impressions, used cars on the road, buyers datafile, touring. Models include: Silver Cloud, S-Series, Continental, Limousine, Silver Cloud II, III, S2, S2LWB.

Other major new features were the engine, cruciform chassis and hydraulically operated front brakes. However, none of this indicates the true historical importance of the MkVI or why the model is at the heart of this book-quite simply the MkVI's design was the well-spring from which all the mainstream Rolls-Royce and Bentley models flowed until the advent of the Silver Shadow and Bentley T-Series in 1965. Here is the complete story of the Rolls-Royce Silver Wraith, Silver Dawn and Silver Cloud and the Bentley MkVI, R-Type and S-Type. Covering concept, design and development, production, promotion, publicity and the coachbuilt cars.
