Playing this book will train your left hand to play trills and gain in speed and agility. This book could be studied along with Finger Exercises for the Cello, Book One get you in shape quickly! How to use this book: Add one page a day to your practice routine. Repeat the page until you are playing as fast as possible. Play each page for 3-5 days before moving on to the next page.

Beginning Technique for the Cello gives you exercises that will improve your playing right from the beginning. Starting with just open string and first finger, the finger exercises help you get stronger and help your fingers move faster. The bowing exercises in this book work on rhythms and developing bow control. Ending with all-important scale studies, the exercises in this book will give you a strong technique that you will use for the rest of your cello playing. After this book, Finger Exercises for the Cello, Book One can be used to train the left hand, while First Position Scale Studies for the Cello can be used to further train the right hand.

Seder, Dimitry Markevitch concludes his preface, or Prelude as he calls it: "History, fact and personal anecdote blend here to provide a complete story of the instrument. May this book entertain you, help you to know the cello to the fullest, and lead you to love it as I do." Reading the book confirms that he has amply accomplished his aims. His qualifications for doing so are of the highest. Markevitch is a performer of considerable note and a teacher at both the Ecole Normale de Musique and Conservatoire Serge Rachmaninoff in Paris. He also has a keen interest in musicology and has edited many works for publication. The book is divided into three parts: "The Instrument," tracing the history of the cello and cello bow from earliest times, "The Performers," anecdotes of historical cellists plus a long section on Markevitch's friend Piatigorsky, and "Great Moments for the Cello," development of cello repertoire.

Compiled by Alwin Schroeder, a former cellist with the Boston Symphony Orchestra and an experienced teacher, this collection of 80 exercises constitutes the first book of a three-volume set. Schroeder drew upon his extensive experience to create original études for instructing students, and in this work he combines them with several others by his distinguished nineteenth-century European colleagues: Karl Schröder, Ferdinand Büchler, Friedrich Dotzauer, Auguste Franchomme, Friedrich Grützmacher, and Sebastian Lee. The carefully selected studies are arranged in order of increasing complexity, and Schroeder provides suggestions for fingering, bowing, and dynamics. Cello students and teachers will find these exercises a splendid resource for the improvement of technique and performance.

You Can Have Faster Fingers Finger Exercises for the Cello, Book One gives you notes to play that will make your fingers more agile. The double stop exercises included help correct collapsed fingers and encourage good hand alignment. By playing this book at the beginning of a practice session, you will ensure that the rest of your practice is more in tune. Teachers: this book is a useful warm-up that ensures that the rest of the lesson will go more smoothly.

Arpeggio Studies in Two Octaves for the Cello helps teach first through seventh positions through major arpeggios in all keys. Each two-page study presents the arpeggios in a different rhythm or bow variation to solidify your technique. Who this book can help Intermediate students who have learned some higher (5th-7th) positions and would like to move beyond scales and improve their shifting. The ten essays in this volume explore different aspects of the performance of instrumental works by Beethoven. Each essay discusses performance issues from Beethoven's time to the present, whether the objective be to realise a performance in an historically appropriate manner, to elucidate the interpretation of Beethoven's music by conductors and performers, to clarify transcriptions by editors or to reconstruct the experience of the listener in various different periods. Four contributions focus on the piano music while another group concentrates on Beethoven's music for strings. These chapters are complemented by an examination of Beethoven's exploitation of the developing wind choir, an evaluation of early twentieth-century recordings as pointers to early nineteenth-century performance practice and an historical survey of rescorings in Beethoven's symphonies.

Half of these twelve original essays by international authorities are critical analyses of Brahms's music, while the remainder discuss influences, the reception of his music and his place in history.

In *Crossing Paths*, John Daverio explores the connections between art and life in the works of three giants of musical romanticism. Drawing on contemporary critical theory and a wide variety of nineteenth-century sources, he considers topics including Schubert and Schumann's uncanny ability to evoke memory in music, the supposed cryptographic practices of Schumann and Brahms, and the allure of the Hungarian Gypsy style for Brahms and others in the Schumann circle. The book offers a fresh perspective on the music of these composers, including a comprehensive discussion of the 19th century practice of cryptography, a debunking of the myth that Schumann and Brahms planted codes for "Clara Schumann" throughout their works, and attention to the late works of Schumann not as evidence of the composer's descent into madness but as inspiration for his successors. Daverio portrays the book's three key players as musical storytellers, each in his own way simulating the structure of lived experience in works of art. As an intimate study of three composers that combines cultural history and literary criticism with deep musicological understanding, *Crossing Paths* is a rich exploration of memory, the re-creation of artistic tradition, and the value of artistic influence.
