Thanksgiving is an international traditional holiday, originally celebrating the Pilgrims' arrival into the New World. Thanksgiving is a national or international religious holiday marking the release of Native Americans from European explorers. Thanksgiving is usually a time for sharing and giving thanks to God. It is one of the busiest times of the year with families gathered in the kitchen to prepare meals for the family. Thanksgiving is a national or international religious festival marking the preparation of Native American harvest festival. The Pilgrims, a group of mainly British and Irish immigrants who were escaping religious persecution, arrived in the Americas as early settlers. They settled at what is now called Plymouth, Massachusetts in the mid 16th century and called it Shoshone Country. Thanksgiving festivals are celebrated differently in most countries but all of them generally mark thanksgiving with different ways of displaying the festival. In Europe, thanksgiving fun facts are usually related to harvesting activities. This is usually done by having an important person, usually a family member, deliver a basket of fruits, vegetables, gifts or other foods to their relatives and friends. In some regions of the world, thanksgiving fun facts include a variety of special foods or gift things that can be given to anyone who would appreciate them. These items include nuts, roots, seeds, potatoes, pumpkins, carrots, beets, hay, wheat, corn, and fruits. Some of these foods are not very popular around Thanksgiving Day like pumpkins and corn, so other kinds of fruits or vegetables may be substituted.

For example, instead of giving thanks for a good harvest, people in some parts of Africa offer thanksgiving tokens instead. When someone eats or drinks something from this kind of token, a special blessing is pronounced over the person. Another form of thanksgiving is the carving of thanksgiving figures representing the religious meaning of Thanksgiving. For example, thanksgiving figures are made in China, Japan, Korea, Egypt, and other Asian countries where thanksgiving is a national holiday. On the other hand, thanksgiving figures are also carved on public holidays in the United States, like thanksgiving day. The main difference between carving a thanksgiving figure and doing it during a harvest festival is that in the US thanksgiving dinner is a public holiday while in China thanksgiving feasts are private events that are only open to family members and close friends. Thanksgiving festivals have been celebrated in almost every country as a national holiday since the beginning of agriculture. As an indigenous American holiday, thanksgiving was considered sacred by Native Americans and it was celebrated with great joy and happiness. Thanksgiving celebrations grew in popularity in the European countries, and soon after the Industrial Revolution, they became very popular in the US. Today, thanksgiving has come to be a time for many Americans to express their love of family, neighbors, and friends.

For half a century Sarah Josepha Hale was the most influential woman in America. As editor of Godey's Lady's Book, Hale was the leading cultural arbiter for the growing nation. Women (and many men) turned to her for advice on what to read, what to cook, how to behave, and—most important—what to think. Twenty years before the declaration of women's rights in Seneca Falls, NY, Sarah Josepha Hale used her powerful pen to promote women's right to an education, to work, and to manage their own money. There is hardly an aspect of nineteenth-century culture in which Hale did not figure prominently as a pathbreaker. She was one of the first editors to promote American authors writing on American themes. Her stamp of approval advanced the reputations of Edgar Allan Poe, Harriet Beecher Stowe, and Nathaniel Hawthorne. She wrote the first antislavery novel, compiled the first women's history book, and penned the most recognizable verse in the English language, "Mary Had a Little Lamb." Americans' favorite holiday—Thanksgiving—wouldn't exist without Hale. Re-imagining the New England festival as a patriotic national holiday, she conducted a decades-long campaign to make it happen. Abraham Lincoln took up her suggestion in 1863 and

proclaimed the first national Thanksgiving. Most of the women's equity issues that Hale championed have been achieved, or nearly so. But women's roles in the "domestic sphere" are arguably less valued today than in Hale's era. Her beliefs about women's obligations to family, moral leadership, and principal role in raising children continue to have relevance at a time when many American women think feminism has failed them. We could benefit from re-examining her arguments to honor women's special roles and responsibilities. Lady Editor re-creates the life of a major nineteenth-century woman, whose career as a writer, editor, and early feminist encompassed ideas central to American history.
