'Sometimes watching him,' Brown writes, 'is like looking at the man in the moon – but you know there is actually no man there. But if Walker is so insubstantial, why does he feel so important? What is he trying to show me?' In The Boy in the Moon, Brown sets out to answer that question, a journey that takes him into deeply touching and troubling territory. 'All I really want to know is what goes on inside his off-shaped head,' he writes. 'But every time I ask, he somehow persuades me to look into my own.'

Over the next four decades, the local troublemakers become pariahs despised by the police and scorned by their neighbors for allegedly manufacturing an urban myth and a resident bogeyman. Periodic and terrifying visits from Andy's abductor leave clues to sift through and a reason to hope. In time, it becomes clear that the local cops are protecting the monster and guarding a secret of their own. After earning a graduate degree in modern history, the author began his investigation of American cultural beliefs during the latter half of the past century. His book is character driven and examines the rapid and profound changes in American attitudes that have led to serious conflicts within families, communities and groups of friends.
