The Rationale of Verse Paperback - February 1, 2015 by Edgar Allan Poe "The Rationale of Verse" is an essay by Edgar Allan Poe (born Edgar Poe; January 19, 1809 - October 7, 1849) was an American author, poet, editor, and literary critic. He is considered part of the American Romantic Movement. Best known for his tales of mystery and the macabre, Poe was one of the earliest American practitioners of the short story, and is generally considered the inventor of the detective fiction genre. He is also credited with contributing to the emerging genre of science fiction. He was the first well-known American writer to support himself living through writing alone, resulting in a financially difficult life and career. Born in Boston, he was the second child of David Poe, Sr. His father abandoned the family in 1810, and his mother died the following year. Thus orphaned, the child was taken to live with his aunt, Frances Allan, of Richmond, Virginia. Although they never formally adopted him, Poe was with them well into young adulthood. Tension developed later as John Allan and Edgar repeatedly clashed over debts, including those incurred by gambling, which led to the loss of secondary education for the young man. Poe attended the University of Virginia for one semester but left due to a quarrel with Allan over the funds for his education and enlisted in the Army in 1827 under an assumed name. His publishing career began, albeit humbly, with an anonymous collection of poems, Tamerlane and Other Poems (1827)
