This was not the usual pattern starts up again every time I have contact with Uri, even if I'm thousands of kilometers from him. Now, intrigued, I began researching Uri, and found that everything he had told David - such as my absolute insistence that he had never been validated by science - was wrong. Even so, Uri's life has been so packed with extraordinary, bizarre and fascinating incidents, and so rammed with stories, that 17 years after first meeting him, I'm still learning. This book concerns a side of Uri that even many who know him well will not have been aware of until now.
