She lived on Hill Top Farm in the Lake District that same year. In 1913, Potter married local lawyer William Heelis. She was a successful breeder of sheep and well regarded for her work to protect the beautiful countryside she adored. In her will, she left her land holdings to the National Trust to protect it from development and to preserve it for future generations.
